<P>On March 27, 1979, a pump failed in the reactor cooling system eventually causing a pressure relief valve to open. The valve failed to close and millions of gallons of contaminated water flowed onto the basement floor and some radioactive elements escape the building. The prison was designed to hold 10,000 but swelled to over 32,000 at a time when the confederates could not afford to feed and clothe them. By the time the war ended, many people were literally nothing but skin and bones.</P>
