- GPS coordinates in degrees decimal rounded to the nearest 0.0001 degree
- Available hours
- Bonus description including important notes as needed
- Bonus requirements in *italic type*
- A photo of the bonus object

WARNING: DO NOT LEAVE ON A LEG UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THAT ALL PAPERWORK IS IN YOUR RALLY PACKAGE FOR THAT LEG. EACH PAGE IS NUMBERED. THIS IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

CRITICAL: Please be respectful when placing your flag in photos. Private property and priceless museum pieces should never be used as your flag support.

This bonus listing is like a restaurant menu. If you order everything on the menu and eat it, you are going to get sick and perhaps die. Please choose bonus destinations carefully.

- ✓ All times are local unless otherwise specified.
- ✓ Unless otherwise specified, rally ID flags are required in all photos.
- ✓ To earn *any* bonus, you MUST claim it on the Claimed Bonus form. This includes:
 - ▶ Rest bonuses
 - ▶ Call-In bonuses
 - ▶ Tracking bonuses

If you lose the Claimed Bonus form, you will earn no bonus points for the leg.

Monitoring Bonuses

Call-In Bonus

CALL1 **1000 points**

Call on Tuesday, June 22, 2021, between 10:00AM and 10:00PM EASTERN DAYLIGHT TIME

The same procedure applies to all Call-in Bonuses available during the rally.

Call from anywhere.

Call and leave the following information:

- 1) Your name
- 2) Your rider number
- 3) Your location (city/town and state)
- 4) The last bonus you scored
- 5) The next bonus you are heading for

Note: Once you have finished recording your information, if you wish to listen to your message, press the # key and then the number 1. You may then accept it or re-record.

Rest Bonus

REST1

Document a stop for four (4) or more hours starting on Wednesday, June 23, 2021.

Requirements:

- ▶ Document a stop for 4 or more hours beginning on the starting day above
- ▶ Earn **6 points per minute** for staying in one place for a minimum of 4 hours, up to 8 hours maximum credit
- ▶ Your starting receipt may be on Tuesday, but you must then document at least 4 hours on Wednesday (no points are earned before 12:00:01 AM that day).
- ▶ As long as you begin your rest on the starting day, you can continue earning credit on the following day.
- ▶ Reminder: All times are local and the Rest Bonus must start on the specified day *for time zone you are in.*

Tracking Bonus

Earn points for using a satellite tracking system that is functioning properly and leaving tracks of your position accessible by Iron Butt Rally Staff.

Near these peaks was a top secret solar observatory that was used during WWII to learn when solar flares occurred. This data was relayed to Washington so military planners would know when to expect interference on radio communications. This information was used to schedule every major operation of World War II.

The story told is that staff at the Hotel Colorado wanted to raise the spirits of President Roosevelt, who returned empty-handed from a bear hunt. Housekeeping staff patched together a bear sewn from pieces of old fabric and presented the stuffed animal to the president. Roosevelt's daughter Alice was delighted by the gift and dubbed the bear "Teddy" after her father.

Take a photo of the display case with the President Theodore Roosevelt pictures and teddy bear history. This case is east down the hall from the hotel reception desk.

The First Reinforced Concrete Bridge in the US

This bridge was built in 1893 for a cost of \$830. The Portland cement was imported from Germany.

Take a photo of the "First Reinforced Concrete Bridge Built in the United States 1893" plaque on the rock on the north side of the park with the concrete arch span in the background.

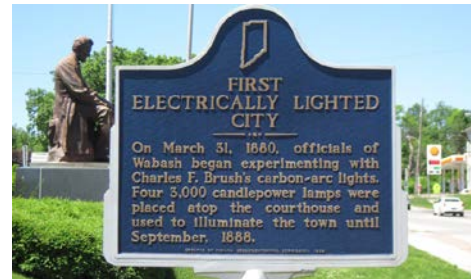
Johnny Gruelle, born here in 1880, is best known for bringing Raggedy Ann to the children of the world

On March 31, 1880 four carbon-arc lamps were placed atop the courthouse, thereby becoming the first city to enjoy electric street lights.

Take a photo of the "First Electrically Lighted City" marker, along S Wabash St, on the east side of the Wabash County Courthouse.

Earl Bakken was the inventor of the first implantable pacemaker and the co-founder of Medtronic. He founded the Bakken Museum in 1975.

As per the inscription on the grave marker, William McKitterick was the first known person to induce swarming bees to enter a hive by retaining the queen bee. If true, this was a major milestone in commercial agriculture.

David Houston is best known for his patent for a roll film apparatus, used to roll film in early cameras. He sold the rights to William Walker for \$700. Walker then sold the rights to Eastman Dry Plate and Film Company of Rochester (Eastman Kodak). Conflicts between Eastman and Houston arose and Houston began to sell his improved designs to Eastman's competitors.

Take a photo of the Houston House at Bonanzaville USA.

Note: There is normally a fee to enter Bonanzaville, but if you let them know you are an IBR rider they will defer the fee to let you ride in, get your photo of the Houston House, and ride back out. This offer is only available during the rally time frame.

The 100th longitudinal line west of Greenwich was a major milestone set by Congress for the first transcontinental railroad. Union Pacific reached this point on October 5, 1866.

Take a photo of "The 100th Meridian" historical marker with the Union Pacific caboose in the background.

RURAL

The first rural electric cooperative was formed just south of here in 1935. At the time nearly 90 per cent of rural America was without electricity.

The signature scene, a dangerous buffalo hunt from the movie *The Covered Wagon* was filmed here on Antelope Island. Released in 1924, this silent movie was the first western epic ever produced.

Carl Eliason developed the prototype of the modern snowmobile here in Sayner. He mounted a small marine engine on a toboggan, steered with skis on the front and driven with a track at the rear. What could possibly go wrong? Hold my schnapps.

Rally staff will be available at 5 pm for scoring.

Dinner will be served from 6 to 10pm

Time penalty begins at 8:00:01 pm. After 8:00:00 pm there will be a **10 points per minute** penalty for being late. "Minutes" will be rounded up at one second past the key time. For example, 8:00:01 (one second past 8:00 pm) will be counted as 1 minute late. Any rider who arrives after 10:00:00 pm (beginning 10:00:01 pm) will not be considered a rally finisher.

If you will be late or unable to arrive at the checkpoint, call the Rallymaster immediately
